The Sacrament of the Altar

As the head of the family should teach it to his household. Who does Christ our Lord say about this Sacrament? He says, "This is My body and blood, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."

From the Large Catechism: If, therefore, you are heavy laden and feel your weakness, then go joyfully to this Sacrament and receive refreshment, comfort, and strength. If you wait until you are rid of such burdens, so that you might come to the Sacrament pure and worthy, you must stay away forever. In that case Christ pronounces sentence and says, "If you are pure and godly, you have no need of Me, and I, in turn, no need of you." Therefore, the only people who are called unworthy are those who neither feel their weaknesses nor wish to be considered sinners.
