




The Sermon

The Small Catechism

What is the Ninth Commandment? You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

What is the Tenth Commandment? You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR: PSALM 22 (antiphon v. 19)

O Lord, do not be far off!

Come quickly to my aid!

My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?

Why are You so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?

O my God, I cry by day, but You do not answer,

and by night, but I find no rest.

Yet You are holy,

enthroned on the praises of Israel.

In you our fathers trusted;

they trusted, and You delivered them.

in You they trusted and were not put to shame.

But I am a worm and not a man,

scorned by mankind and despised by the people.

All who see me mock me;

You made me trust You at my mother's breasts.

I will tell of Your name to my brothers;

in the midst of the congregation I will praise You:

You who fear the LORD, praise Him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify Him, and stand in awe of Him, all you offspring of Israel

For He has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and He has not hidden His face from him, but has heard, when he cried to Him.

From You comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear Him.

The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the LORD!

May your hearts live forever!

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall worship before You.

For kingship belongs to the LORD, and He rules over the nations.

All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship;

before Him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive.

Posterity shall serve Him;

it shall be told of the LORD to the coming generation;

they shall come and proclaim His righteousness to a people yet unborn, that He has done it.
