

THE NICENE CREED

Having heard the Word, what do you believe?

On the Resurrection of Our Lord

As we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord, we focus on the person and work of our Lord Jesus Christ in His state of exaltation, as it is briefly expressed in the Augsburg Confession.

[Our churches teach that Jesus Christ] also descended into hell, and on the third day truly rose again. Afterward He ascended into heaven to sit on the right hand of the Father. There He reigns forever and has dominion over all creatures. He sanctifies those who believe in Him by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts to rule, comfort, and make them alive. He defends them against the devil and the power of sin. The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead.
