Time: 11th to 6th centuries BC

Purpose: To express hope in the Lord God for salvation, using prayers and praises spoken by God's people at the tabernacle and temple or by individuals

Psalm 32

Psalm 32 (ESV) Of David.

- ¹Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.
- ²Blessed is the man against whom the Lord counts no iniquity,
 - and in whose spirit there is no deceit.
- ³ For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.
- ⁴For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer. *Selah*
- ⁵I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity;
- I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin. *Selah*
- ⁶Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him.
- ⁷You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance. *Selah*
- ⁸ I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go;
 - I will counsel you with my eye upon you.
- ⁹Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you.
- ¹⁰ Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who trusts in the Lord.
- ¹¹Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart! Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Penitential Psalm (e.g., Psalms 6, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143) – life of daily repentance Use: before Confession & Absolution, Evening, Lent

vv 1–2 Blessed

- -- covered, not counted
- -- no deceit

vv 3–4 Wasting away

- -- day and night
- -- hand heavy

v 5 Confession

-- liturgy

vv 6–7 Hiding place

- -- time when you may be found
- -- from seclusion to public acknowledgement

vv 8–9 Instruction

vv 10-11 Proverbs of trust in the Lord
