
Ash Wednesday Divine Liturgy

Note: Ash Wednesday begins the special season of penitential reflection that we call Lent. Ashes are a sign of repentance and sorrow and also a reminder of our human mortality. As this day and this season remind us of our sin and its wages, it is with repentant joy that we are also reminded of our forgiveness through Christ's sacrifice on the cross. Intending to amend our sinful lives, we receive with thankfulness the renewal that comes by the forgiveness delivered in the Lord's Supper. 
God the Father in heaven, have mercy.

THE NICENE CREED

The theme for our Wednesday Lenten services is "Holy Bodies." In light of Christ's redemption of our bodies, God the Father regards our bodies as holy, just as holy as the body of His beloved Son, Jesus Christ. This truth changes the way we view and treat our bodies.

Each week we will consider a different perspective on the holiness of our bodies with a reading from St. Paul's letters and by following the body of Jesus through St. Luke's passion account. We will also meditate on Jesus' suffering and death through the hymns and the Litany (Prayer) of the Passion. These are the themes and readings for each week:

March 9 • Holy Sacrifices: Romans 11:30–12:5 & Luke 22:1–38

March 16 • Holy Priests: 2 Corinthians 6:14–7:1 & Luke 22:39–70

March 23 • Holy Temples: 1 Corinthians 6:9–20 & Luke 23:1–25

March 30 • Holy Works: Romans 6:11–23 & Luke 23:26–43

April 6 • Holy Bride: Ephesians 5:25–33 & Luke 23:44–56
