

The Divine Service in Lent

During Lent, our practice is to use a simplified order of service. The "high points" remain the same absolution, the readings, and Holy Communion and draw us to Christ Jesus in repentance and faith.

Prayers for Worship

Before receiving the Sacrament: Most merciful Father, by the Lord's Supper strengthen us to believe that no one can make satisfaction for sin but Christ alone. Enable us to find joy and comfort only in Him, learning from this Sacrament to love You and our neighbor and to bear the cross with patience and joy until the day of the resurrection of our bodies to life immortal; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Thanksgiving after receiving the Sacrament: Blessed Savior, Jesus Christ, You have given Yourself to us in this holy Sacrament. Keep us in Your faith and favor that we may live in You even as You live in us. May Your body and blood preserve us in the true faith to life everlasting. Amen.

For faithfulness unto death: Lord God, heavenly Father, Your Son fought the good fight of faith and was obedient unto death, even death on the cross, pouring out His blood as a peace offering between You and us. Keep us faithful unto death so we may receive the crown of righteousness that He will reward us with on the Last Day, having waited in hope and love for His appearing. Amen.
