

The Divine Service in Lent

During Lent, our practice is to use a simplified order of service. The "high points" remain the same absolution, the readings, and Holy Communion and draw us to Christ Jesus in repentance and faith.

Prayers for Worship

Before receiving the body and blood of Jesus: Hear us, O merciful Father, and grant that all communicants of your Church this day, who partake of this bread and wine, and receive His most blessed Body and Blood according to Your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, remember of His death and passion in true repentance and living faith; to Him, with You and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. Amen.

Thanksgiving after Holy Communion: We thank You, almighty God, that through this precious meal of grace You have refreshed and satisfied us. Use it to increase our faith and advance us in godliness and all Christlike virtues; through Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
