During Lent, our practice is to use a simplified order of service. The "high points" remain the same absolution, the readings, and Holy Communion and draw us to Christ Jesus in repentance and faith.

Prayers for Worship

Before worship: O Lord, our creator, redeemer, and comforter, as we come together to worship You in spirit and in truth, we humbly pray that You would open our hearts to the preaching of Your Word so that we may repent of our sins, believe in Jesus Christ as our only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear us for His sake. Amen.

Christian Questions & Answers

Prepared by Dr. Martin Luther for those who intend to go to the Sacrament.

After confession and instruction in the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, Christians may ask themselves these questions:

1. *Do you believe that you are a sinner*? Yes, I believe it. I am a sinner.

2. *How do you know this*? From the Ten Commandments, which I have not kept.

3. Are you sorry for your sins? Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.

4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins? His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal damnation. See Rom. 6:21, 23.

5. Do you hope to be saved? Yes, that is my hope.

6. *In whom then do you trust?* In my dear Lord Jesus Christ.

7. Who is Christ? The Son of God, true God and man. Luther's Small Catechism © 1986 Concordia Publishing House, cph.org.
